





# Special season for father and son

Eddie Paisley has teed off Stocksfield's centenary in style now he hopes Chris can make it a fantastic year for the Northumberland club

here's only thing that would put the icing on the cake for Eddie Paisley in his year as centenary captain of Stocksfield.

And that's to see son Chris win in his rookie season on the European Tour. Too much to ask? Possibly not with Chris making a steady start to this first season on tour including a good finish in Morocco and making the cut in Spain.

But Chris took a quick break from the tour to join with his father and brothers Andy, head pro at Hexham, and Ric, who plays at Stocksfield as Eddie drove in as captain of the club with Ladies Captain Jo Blackburn and Seniors Captain Dick Forth in attendance.

All the captains drove in successfully and the drive-in set in motion the Braidwood Cup, with Chris following his dad round the course where he first honed his own skills. The tournament was won by Dave Fenwick with a fine score of 40 points, followed by Phil Armstrong and Garry Thomson with 38 points.

Chris, 27, who represented Great Britain and Ireland in the 2009 Walker Cup, is attached to Close House, and both clubs – along with Eddie – will be hoping for the big breakthrough this year but Chris's target will be very much keeping his card on his first foray in the big time.

Stocksfield have a full programme planned for their centenary year and have already published a centenary history and held a very successful sportsman's dinner attended by Chris and Andy and Matfen Hall's European Seniors Tour players and top coach John Harrison who took part in a question and answer session.

Other events on the centenary schedule include a Hickory Golf Club Day with British Golf Collectors Society on June 16 and matches against Tynemouth and Seahouses, whose centenary it also is while there is to be a Centenary Pro-am on June 21 and several centenary opens and competitions with the club's 100th anniversary dinner on November 16.

Over the years, the Stocksfield club have produced some fine players.

Andrew, Chris and Chris McDonnell (now at the Royal Club in Bahrain) are previous County Champions— and for a time Walker Cup player David Curry was also a member.

It's a tough course, neatly tucked away in natural woodland with marvellous views, with a testing par of 70 combining tricky par threes and tough par fours.

The front nine holes are set in woodland with fairways carved through oak, ash, birch and beech, and there is an interesting mix of holes with doglegs in both directions, dissected in many places by several interesting streams. Stocksfield started

life as a nine-hole course in 1913 with just 100 members and moved to its present site in 1949. The course was extended to 18 holes in 1975 and it really is a game of two halves with the front nine carved through stands of oak, birch, beech and ash.

Not surprisingly, the nine requires good club selection and accuracy. The second half - the original parkland course - is more open and forgiving, but there's still plenty of danger, but at least it boasts stunning views across the Tyne Valley and the Cheviots and the Borders.





# Captains take the helm at Matfen

**European Seniors Tour Player John** Harrison signalled the start of the new season at Matfen Hall when he introduced new captains Neil Conway and Barbara Clayton.

The Matfen Hall head pro will, no doubt, be combining a busy season with playing on the Seniors Tour, coaching top players including Ken Ferrie and running one of the bet golf operations in the North.

Not many set-ups can boast 27 holes, an excellent par three course and driving range in a stunning location with a clubhouse and a top-quality hotel.

The drive in was followed by a nine hole Texas scramble competition with Alfy Wood eagling the second to help his team including Jimmy Howarth, John Urwin and Doug Stuart to victory.

Matfen golf manager Peter Smith said: "The course is in excellent condition for the time of year and everything is in place for Matfen to have another memorable golfing year."

Both Harrison and Ferrie will be hoping for the same as their season starts to really get under way.

Fourth place in the Spanish Senior Open was the highlight of Harrison's second Senior Tour campaign as he finished the year in 32nd position on the Order of Merit, a steady improvement from 41st position in his debut season.

It was a hat-trick of Harrisons on the Senior Tour, following in the footsteps of elder brothers Philip and Steve and he did play on the European Tour as did Phil experienced that has proved crucial in his coaching career with double European Tour winner Ferrie.

Harrison has been Ferrie's coach since the Ashington lad was 16 but there's more to him than that as he proves by winning regularly on the North and NE and NW PGA scene and more than holding his own on the Seniors



# Youth and experience combine to win trophy

exham relied on the experience of Martin Coup and the precocious talent of 15-year-old Matty Lamb to lift the first major trophy of North-East county season.

Lamb, who plays off scratch, and the 46-year-old Coup teamed up at Heworth as Hexham pipped Prudhoe at the first extra hole of the Northumberland final of the intercounty foursomes in the morning and then got the better of Durham champions Darlington 4 and 3 in the overall final.

Victory earned the pair an immediate call up to the Northumberland team for their county match against the Lothians at Prestonfield.

Last season, Foxton's Jake Storey won the England Under-16 championship, the McGregor Trophy, also captured by Jack Hermeston (City of Newcastle) in 2011.

A winner of the Scottish Under-14 title and runner-up in the England Under 16 championship, Lamb has also been capped for England Under 16s and with Coup, a former PGA pro, eliminated Rothbury, Bedlingtonshire, Close House and Magdelene Fields in previous rounds.

In the Northumberland final, they were three down to Prudhoe's Shaun Philipson and James Curry but battled back to all square and it went to the 19th where Lamb holed a 35-footer for birdie.

In the Durham final, Darlington pair Andrew Wilson and Darren Tate beat Ravensworth's Joe Fraser and Jordan Bettis by one hole, but Wilson, a beaten finalist last year suffered the same fate when Hexham came through 4 and 3.

It was almost a double winning weekend for Lamb when he finished

one shot off the leaders in the North and South Trophy at Morpeth.

The home club's Sandy Twynholm and Andrew Gibson (Northumberland tied on 147 with Lamb on 148, the title going to Twynholm with the better second round score.

And Lamb also missed out in the Northumberland Schools Championship at Prudhoe where he tied with Westerhope's Brad Robinson on 75, Robinson taking the title with the better back nine.

# Family driving force behind popular course

# Club's motto is golf to be enjoyed and not endured and that's how it's meant to be

t's a real family affair at Cocken
Lodge these days.
Kevin Gow and his wife
Jacqueline took over the lease of
the 18-bay driving range and nine-hole
golf course on the outskirts of Durham
City two years ago and progress has
been remarkable.

Daughters Samantha and Georgia are now also heavily involved in running the popular complex which in itself is family owned with Lucy Holmes developing it from a caravan park to a USGA standard short course and floodlit driving range which has earned an impressive reputation.

It's no pitch and putt lay-out with two short par fours and the rest par threes. Quite narrow in places with water hazards, it is quite scenic and has a particular charm.

The shortest hole measures just 119 yards but you have to navigate the pond and the longest is a 261 yard dog-leg par four with trouble on the left and right - attempt to hit the green at your peril!


The course is extremely popular

with experienced and new golfers alike, it appeals especially to families as nine holes should only take approximately one and a half hours to play.

There is floodlit driving range which has 12 covered bays and six outdoor, which is getting a facelift this month with brand new top quality mats, and new golf balls being introduced.

The comfortable clubhouse which offers home-cooked food and is also popular with families. There are no stuffy dress rules and as Kevin says: "The only dress code we have is we ask people to dress sensibly. We don't turn people away in jeans and trainers as we want families and youngsters to feel welcome here as well as the regular golfer or someone just taking up the game."

That's evident in the offers with children under 18 (under 16s must be with an adult) paying just half rates while at the other end of the scale "Cocken Codgers" that's 60 years and over also getting half price rates on the course between 8am and 12 noon



on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays

There's also a welcome for the experienced golfer with a PGA teaching staff including Doug Brolls and Ryan Ingram as well as Kevin, who has been based at Houghton and the Mayfair Centre and did teach at Cocken when based at Houghton.

The target is to maintain improvements in both course and clubhouse, offer quality teaching and also continue to make families, groups and parties welcome. Their motto at Cocken is "Golf is to be enjoyed not endured." Would that we all thought like that. # School is top class

Walbottle trio Ben Crawford, James Wilson and Kieran Watson have clinched a place in the final of the National Schools Championship.

The trio made their local knowledge pay off in the Northumberland Schools Team Championships at Prudhoe – Ben and James are both junior members there while Kieran was a member at Close House.

There were 11 schools entered and Walbottle Campus finished top of the pile to go through to the National Finals on July 10 at Woodhall Spa.

James also won the under 16 nett prize while Matty Lamb, who partnered Martin Coup to victory in the Northumberland and Durham Inter-County Foursomes was playing for Hexham School and won the under 16 gross prize with Close House junior Bradley Robinson representing Kings School Tynemouth, won the overall gross prize.

England cap Lamb is a winner of the Close House Lee Westwood Scholarship along with Ramside Hall's Kat Hollins.

Last year Lamb won
the Scotland Under-14
Championship and was
runner-up in the England
championship and both he
and Kat get a year's free
membership of Close House,
free monthly golf lessons for a
year and free-range balls plus a
free Close House golf bag and
cap and – more importantly –
will get to meet Close House
touring pro Lee Westwood.

Westwood's backing for junior golf is really expanding and the first events of the new Lee Westwood Golf Tour are now taking place.

# Callum enjoying Stateside success

Durham's Callum Tarren has been making the headlines on the USA college golf scene.

Callum, twice a winner of the Durham County title when playing at Dinsdale Spa, is at Radford University in Virginia, and he was named the men's golfer of the week by the Big South Conference following his showing in the Battle at the Beach competition in South Carolina.

He led after two rounds but was unable to improve on his score on the final day and finished third but his career-best return over 54 holes was his third top 10 finish of the season and helped Radford win the team event.

Callum has been in good form for a while. He set a course record round of 64 at the Williamsburg Country Club on his way to a runners-up spot in the Joe Agee Invitational last September and recently he finished tied 18th at the Old Dominion OBX Intercollegiate

and tied sixth at the Davidson Intercollegiate before his Battle at the Beach success

"I've had a very steady start to the golf season," said Tarren. "I'm very happy with how I am playing and I'm confident I can improve on my individual results and get a win soon. It is important to keep yourself motivated and dedicated. My game feels solid at the moment which I am happy with. Now I'm looking forward to the next few events."

Callum played out of Dinsdale and Rockliffe Hall before going to the USA where he is in his third year studying marketing and economics. He won the Durham County Championship in 2009 at Seaton Carew and successfully defended the title at South Moor in 2010. Last year he was the first Radford men's golfer since 2006 to be named in the Big South Men's Golf All-Academic Team.

# Welcome to the leisure dome

*Is this the future for family golf?* 

t may look like something from Space 1999 but the Golf Dome's arrival on Seaton Carew's sea front is very much present day and down to earth.







# Pulling the rabbits out of a hat

Dean Bailey reports on how a rapidly expanding league gives those with high handicaps a chance to win for their club

laying for your golf club has long been the preserve of low handicappers but the North East Rabbits Golf Association (NERGA) is giving the biggest group of club golfers, those with handicaps of 16-24, the chance to represent their club and take a trophy home at the end of the year.

Set up three years ago NERGA has grown rapidly, with 23 teams taking part this season, stretching from Newcastle to York. Having grown from

just five teams, NERGA Secretary Martin Hill believes that the league's strength is that it offers benefits to golfers and their clubs, "The reaction we've received from both players and clubs is excellent.

"The players absolutely love it. The best thing for them is the opportunity to play courses they wouldn't normally go to. The team at my home club Dinsdale Spa were really excited when they found out we were playing three courses in the Newcastle area, and

we're getting the same reaction from a lot of the clubs. "It's great for the clubs too; all the money we take on the day goes to the club plus anything they make over the bar or in the pro shop."

Last year Kirkbymoorside Golf Club in North Yorkshire won the NERGA Championship,

This year's championship will take place at Rudding Park, Huddersfield.

The league has struck a sponsorship deal with Cleveland Golf for this season and has agreed a deal to play the Championship day at Rudding Park for the next two years, "We're very grateful to Rudding Park for their commitment to the final day of the season. It's great to have a top-class venue for our biggest day," Hill said.

The NERGA is always on the lookout for new teams and is aiming to become the largest golf league in the North over the next three years. "Our aim is to get another group of teams [eight] involved for the start of next season. From there we'd like

to get another eight the year after. I think we can get up to 50 or 60 teams in the next three years, making us the biggest golf league anywhere in the North," Hill explained. This season the 23 teams are split into three groups with each club hosting one event, on either a Saturday or Sunday. The events bring together 64 players, the 56 away players paying a £10 green fee. Teams of eight then take part in a singles stableford competition, with full handicap allowance, with the

top seven scores on the day counting towards the team's total. The winning club on the day receives 8 points, second seven and so on.

The top club in each group then take part in the NERGA Championship final. They are joined on the day by the leading points scorers from each of the 23 clubs who play for the Player of the Year title – won last year by Kirbymoorside's Chris Knowles.

He's joined on the tour by City of Newcastle's Phil Ridden who tied 15th at Frilford Heath on seven under while the likes of Close House's Andy Scrimshaw, Hartlepool's Alex Wrigley, Morpeth's Steven Fawcitt and Bedlingtonshire's Mathew Webb all finished well enough to guarantee a number of starts.

Cowan's been on a bit of a run with a win the NE and NW PGA Spring Pro-am at Archerfield Links where he followed a level par 72 on the Fidra course with a magnificent three-under-par 69 on the Dirleton course for a one-stroke victory over Andrew Baston (Ponteland) and Martin Forster (Tynedale).

He was in the frame again when Jonathan Lupton (Close House) won the NE and NW PGA Pro Series event at the Wynyard Club.

In strong winds, Lupton posted a one under par 71 which was good enough to hold off a strong challenge from Graeme Bell (Eaglescliffe), Cowan and Mark Ridley (South Moor) all on 72.

Darren Pearce (Barnard Castle) aced the 15th at Seahouses with an eight iron on his way to 67 and victory in the NE and NW PGA Pro Series tournament there. It was the fifth ace of his career and just four days earlier he holed his three iron for an albatross two at Barnard Castle's par five ninth.

# A wildlife haven for good golfers

Alan Hedley takes a trip down the A19 and finds it's not the road to hell but a trip to an excellent course

t's no surprise Billingham has produced so many talented and exceptional golfers because this is quite an exceptional and challenging course.

It's not hugely long, but at nearly 6,350 yards, with undulating tree-lined tight fairways demanding accuracy and tricky greens demanding clear-thinking club selection, it's not surprising it has churned out a string of quality county players and professionals.

Based just off the A19, it's parkland and demands some stamina, but there is always the option of a buggy or powered trolley.

Because of its hilly nature, there are a number of blind shots but there are also some fine views over Teesside and the Cleveland Hills and thanks to the club's tree-planting programme, the course is a real joy and haven for wildlife including foxes, geese, squirrels, birds and deer.

There's a splendid clubhouse overlooking the ninth and 18th greens with an excellent professional's shop run by Mike Ure and an extensive practice area and driving range.

Don't be lulled into a false sense of security by the gentle opening hole, which is a short par four. Hit it left and you'll be left with a short approach to a slightly elevated green.

The real business starts at the second, a classic risk or reward par five where avoiding the fairway bunker, the out of bounds and the ditch in the dip short of the green is key as is the tee shot at the third because it's blind!

There's no let-up with a tough par four (stroke index 2) next and an equally difficult par three



from an elevated tee to a smallish green with a deep greenside bunker.

There's some relief at six, a short par four which is reachable from an elevated tee to a green set at the bottom of the hill, but there are trees either side of green.

You need to be right at the next with out of bounds down the left and it's followed by a lovely par three played from an elevated tee to a long narrow green with a deep bunker at the front – don't be long though.

The front nine ends with a nice par five and a shortish par five gets the back nine under way and it's a good birdie chance if you make sure the drive is down the left.

Par is premium at the signature hole 11th (see Factfile) and there are chances at the 12th, which

is a par five, the 13th which is a right to left dog-leg to an elevated green and the short uphill 14th with the green set into the bank.

Again, the 15th is a par five and as it's under 500 yards, it must be considered a birdie chance but it is an undulating hole with a ditch at the bottom of the dip.

The finish is testing but not impossible with 16 being a similar par three to the 14th but more uphill and therefore one club more than 14 while 17 is a short but tight par four with a tree-lined fairway and it's not necessarily a driver.

The final hole is also not a long par four but it needs a straight drive over the valley to leave an approach to a well-bunkered smallish green...do not be long!


DON'T assume it's always a driver off the tee. Make sure you keep it in play and out of trees!

### SIGNATURE HOLE

The 388 yard 11th is just a classic par four which proves it doesn't need to be 400 yards plus to be a great golf hole. The pressure is all on the drive where you need to avoid the ditch running along the left and then on the approach which has to make it over the pond in front of the green.

 Billingham has always been user-friendly when it comes to junior golf so it is not surprising the club has been awarded the coveted GolfMark with the added distinction of High Achiever status. This is awarded to those golf clubs who have met additional conditions over and above the minimum standards required.

Of the 13 Durham clubs with GolfMark recognition, it is only the third one to be awarded the High Achiever status. Billingham has won many county titles, team championships and national titles, including the Lytham Trophy.

# Happy 10th birthday to Jarrow Arrow's star-studded COCO day

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Steve Cram Celebrity Golf Day in aid of COCO. Dean Bailey talks golf and charity with the Jarrow Arrow

teve Cram made the career move from athletics to broadcasting with ease, becoming a regular on the BBC and playing a key role in the London 2012 coverage. But, by his own admission, golf does not come quite as easy to the 52 year-old.

"I used to play a lot back in the 90s and towards the end of my running career. Since I've retired from running, life has taken over and I've had to start doing other things so over the last few years I've played less and less," Cram explained. "It is a goal of mine, over the next three or four years, to get out and start playing a little bit more."

Cram did, however, find time to play during his athletics career, which included a World Championship gold in 1983 and a silver at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles, "I started playing off and on when I was 19.

"When I was training a lot, getting out for a game of golf during the day was great. I played quite a bit and I was able to get down to about 14," he said.

With a golfing CV that includes the likes of Royal Melbourne and The Belfry, golf courses in the North East still have a special place in Cram's heart. "I still have a soft spot for my old club Morpeth. It's where I've shot most of my best rounds over the years.

"I tend to play a lot at Slaley, Matfen, Close House and Hexham, but I've played a lot of courses in the North East. I do genuinely like Slaley. I first started going there when it was set up and I've always enjoyed it. The Hunting course is challenging but I really enjoy it.

"I think I've played the 18th well once.

I seem to get there with a good round going and then it all goes down hill.

"The idea of joining the local club just isn't appealing to me at the moment. Maybe in 10 years time I'll be able to play nine holes and then sit in the clubhouse with a pint and enjoy it a bit more," he explained.

Not a fan of the winter weather, Cram enjoys his golf most when he can play with his shorts on: "I do really need the sun on my back. One of my other favourite places is Desert Springs in Spain. I have a lot of friends there, Daley [Thompson] and Beefy [Sir Ian Botham] have places out there.

"The course is just cacti and rocks with these green swathes of carpet running through it. If I was going to hop on a plane and go somewhere it would be there," he said.

Cram has always had strong friendships with his fellow athletes and has found firm friends in other sportspeople through golf: "I've played with some good golfers over the years. One year in our golf day we allowed the sponsors to pick who they played with and one of them picked Beefy. He's a single figure handicapper and a really good player.

"The team were all high handicappers and perhaps not the best golfers and when Beefy finished he was a little frustrated. The following year I was at his event at Desert Springs and he did the exact opposite to me. He knows my level of golf and he paired me with three ladies – one was the lady captain and the other two were Trish

Johnson and Becky Brewerton. They showed me up all the way round. Of course Beefy kept winding me up and telling me there was a skirt waiting for me in the clubhouse," he explained with a wry smile.

"The COCO golf day has got bigger every year, which is great for us as a fundraiser but it's also a really good way of letting more people, particularly in the North East, know what the charity is and what we do.

"What's great for us is that the fundraising we do on the day carries on. The people who didn't know about us before become friends of the charity, come to other events or start giving or want to know more about other events.

"Our aim is that people want to come back next year and want to help us in other things we're doing," he said.

This year's event is at DeVere Slaley Hall on June 19.





My fantasy four-ball? I love playing with Daley [Thompson] so he'd be in there. Someone I met a couple of times and I would love to have had a game with him was Seve [Ballesteros]. I think everybody would.

I'd quite like to play with Peter Alliss. I'm in broadcasting now and I've always liked his commentary. Playing with Peter would be good because he would find Daley incredibly frustrating - he doesn't know many of the rules, he can hit the ball a long way but he can also hit it three yards. I think he would be thoroughly entertained.

# McCrory's inspiration in his fight to conquer golf

Dean Bailey talks to boxing legend Glenn McCrory about his growing obsession with golf sparked by two years of research into another true champion

ormer world cruiserweight champion Glenn McCrory hopes to make a big impact on North East golf when he hosts the inaugural J Douglas Edgar Golf Day this summer. The event remembers one of the region's, if not the world's, greatest golfers 24 years to the day since the region's greatest boxer won the world title.

McCrory, a fixture on Sky Sports since his world title success, is bringing together local and international sportspeople as well as a number of television personalities for the event at South Moor Golf Club on June 3.

The golf day has come to fruition after two years of research into the life of J Douglas Edgar. Something of a forgotten star, Edgar's finest hour came at the Canadian Open where he claimed a 16-shot victory over a glittering field that included his student Bobby Jones.

His story was brought to McCrory's attention by North East sports journalist John 'Gibbo' Gibson. "Edgar's grandson got in touch with 'Gibbo' and he passed the story on to me. I was fascinated by it," says McCrory, adding: "It's great to think that one of the greatest records of all-time is held by a Geordie."

Generally McCrory, who is not a member of a golf club, plays at

the City of Newcastle Golf Club, where Edgar began his career as an Assistant Professional.

An occasional golfer, McCrory has played off and on for over 20 years and would give himself a rough handicap of 24 – despite having finished second to Willie Thorne in a golf day at DeVere Carden Park in the past.

McCrory is looking to dedicate himself to the game this year, "Being the competitive person that I am, I just really want to make the step and get into it seriously," he explains.

"It's a game where, in the past, I wasn't too bothered - it was just a celebrity thing. Now I've got the bug and I want to play whenever I can.

"I'd love to get to the stage where I'm playing a couple of times a week. One of the problems has been joining a golf club, in the past I've been all over the place going from one country to the next; I just couldn't justify it when I was never going to be there."

McCrory is confident that, with some practice and tuition, he can make a good go at golf. "I'd like to think I could get to single figures. I know what I'm like when I get into something, I get the bug and become obsessed. I'll probably end up as one of those people who spends six hours on the driving range every day."

Boxing and golf share a lot

Sugar Ray Robinson and Joe Louis. Back in the day golf was the sport for exercise, they'd go away to a training camp and the only thing they'd do was play golf all week. Sugar Ray Robinson could do everything – he could dance, he was good looking, I'm sure he'd be able to hit a good ball too."

of common ground, as McCrory explains: "Golf is a very solitary game, there's only yourself to rely on. It's the same in boxing, there's nobody else to back you up, it's just you and you've got to find a way to win"

Sportsmanship also plays a big part in the two sports, "We've bashed the crap out of each other but if Lennox [Lewis] was to walk in now I'd get a big hug and [Mike] Tyson would do the same. Boxing is more like a brotherhood than many other sports," he says.

When it comes to tour golf McCrory harks back to his Irish roots. "Rory's my man," he smiles, adding: "a Belfast boy the same as my family. Aside from him, Tiger Woods is phenomenal.

"I was brought up in the era when Muhammad Ali was breaking through the barriers so many black athletes faced. He changed the sport of boxing, much like Woods did in golf.

"I love seeing anyone who is dominant in their sport. I remember seeing Johnny Wilkinson when I used to train with the Newcastle Falcons. We had trained in the morning, and again in the afternoon and as I was leaving at six o'clock Johnny was still there, still on the field with about 30 balls around him. That is why he is so great."

County Durham-based McCrory remains close to his North East roots and South Moor is a special place to him.

"My priest was a guy called Father Noel Fielding. He was in my dressing room and would bless me before my fights; he played at South Moor and was off scratch for a long time," he explained.

Father Fielding sadly passed away the year before McCrory won the world title but his name lives on at South Moor through the Father Fielding Trophy.

"It was his golf course so there's a big link there with me and my past," McCrory says.

# Tee for two – my starter's guide to golf

Sharon McKee, Lady Golfer of Northumberland, shares her experience of her first-ever round and how she has caught the bug

have played crazy golf on holiday and read about Tiger Woods 'off course' antics - until recently that was the limit of my golfing knowledge.

I then inherited a set of golf clubs and though some may have called them 'out of the ark' I love their vintage solid look..

Spurred on by an offer we couldn't refuse for a round of golf for two on one of those voucher sites, myself and a friend equally lacking in golfing experience set off to play our first ever proper round at Alnwick Golf Club.

The day started off well, we didn't get lost on the way and we got complimentary coffee and a bacon butty in the club house. I briefly mentioned to the chap who welcomed us and gave us a card each that we had never ever done this before. He smiled and disappeared.

We prepared by watching out of the club house window, hoping to spot anyone else already playing to give us a clue of where the start was. Getting my vintage set out of the car, we saw a couple of men with golfing type slacks, jumpers and shiny new sets on wheels. We decided we'd follow them rather than risk their mirth by asking where the

start line was. They made it look quite easy and in a few minutes they were down a small hill, taking the flag out of what we knew by then was the first hole. After that they quickly disappeared and we decided we'd start a little bit closer to the flag, at the brow of the hill to give ourselves a chance, seeing as it was our first time.

There was some debate about which clubs to use – a solid looking wooden one was my favourite while my pal was frustrated that none of them were perfectly straight. Using different ones, we managed to hit the ball, after one or two 'practice' swipes, for what we considered to be a long way.

The disadvantage of my vintage set was that it wasn't on wheels so we had to carry quite a heavy load with us every time we moved. We decided this was just good exercise. My golfing buddy was good at hitting the ball quite far, I was better at was getting it in the right direction. When it came to having to take the flag out of the hole in anticipation we were quite giddy with our success so far. We dutifully filled in the score card, though were a little confused about which colour course we

were doing and whether it was the lady golfers option. The sheet reckoned it was a 4 par hole - we'd made it in 5 and 6. Rather proud of ourselves we picked up our baggage to head to the next one.

There was no one in sight, and we were back to the debate about where we should start the next one from. We walked past a rock, up a hill 'surely we wouldn't be able to get a ball up there' to an area near some smooth looking grass not too far from next the flag. It felt a bit close but we couldn't see anything that told us where to start from. This time the surprise was how difficult it was, even that close, to get the ball into the hole as it turned out to be on a slope.

There was a bigger hill in front of us leading up to where we guessed the next hole would be. At the top as we turned to admire the view behind us, the sky darkened and it started hailstoning. We'd come prepared with flasks and snacks (reckoning rightly it might be a very cold, very long day) and sheltered in some trees for a coffee break.

Waiting for the wintry weather to pass we calculated that we'd taken nearly an hour to get this far - given that there were 18 holes in total we were heading for a very late finish. After a warming cuppa we set off again, spotting the flag ahead – and then also spotting the men who had been in front of us. They were now walking back towards the club house along a parallel path - surely they couldn't have already finished?

After completing the third hole in what we considered quite impressive style and time we noticed there was another large rock – and it had a sign on it telling us how many yards away the next hole was. The penny dropped. That's where you start from.

We felt compelled to try and play properly so we started from the rock. The next flag didn't look too far away – but all the surrounding grass was quite overgrown, or 'rough' as we started trying to use correct terminology too.

Doing it 'properly' proved a challenge. Getting out of the 'rough' was extremely time consuming. We did wonder if there was hidden CCTV and we were providing comical entertainment for those in the club house. Eventually we finally 'did' the fourth and decided maybe to cut the course a little short...

I'm sure in other people's books we may not have had a successful round of golf but we enjoyed ourselves and on the way back were discussing how we should get some practice before booking another round - Golf courses of the north east... you have been warned!

The past month has seen me come up against some of the toughest struggles of my professional golfing career to date. It has involved a mixture of emotions from success through to disappointment,

Looking to build on my great result in South Africa, I began March with a two week tour of the Far East, starting in India. Rather than improving my game, I felt I had taken a step backwards and was left disappointed with my performance. I decided to go back to the drawing board and spent the following week on the driving range working on my drills and figuring out where I went wrong; ready to step up my game in Malaysia.

Prepared to give the game my all once I arrived in Malaysia, I received sad news about a close family friend passing away and decided to return to the UK to support my family. I withdrew from the tournament but after a couple of weeks at home, returned to the game with my next tournament in Morocco.

Fortunately my game got off to a good start on the first day; shooting a 68 and seeing my name shoot to the top of the leader board- my mind set had changed completely. The following day was a little tougher and I found myself fighting to make the cut, but I managed to negotiate the hurdle and went on to finish within the top 30 players for the second time this season; another great platform I aim to build upon for the next season.

Morocco has been a favourite venue for me since I won on the Challenge Tour back in 2004 which secured my card back on to the Main Tour. The course I played on during the Tour is one of the most prestigious courses in the world and is set within the palace grounds of the King of Mexico's residence. Following my success in Morocco, and with the Easter holidays upon us, my wife and I decided to take a break with the children for a few days near Southampton, which somehow involved a trip to Pepper Pig world. Not usually my sort of thing but we all enjoyed it. I also took the opportunity to put in some lessons with my coach at Rockliffe Hall; Head Professional Jon Stacey. He worked me hard on my skills and technique. And I played 18 holes on their championship golf course, which even after a tough winter was in magnificent form.

# Emma's one of England's finest

Northern Golfer Emma Brown is captain of her country with a bulging trophy cabinet but as Alan Hedley discovered there is one championship where she is determined to strike gold

here isn't much in women's amateur golf that escaped Emma Brown, one of the finest players of her generation, except a winner's medal in the European Ladies Championship.

As Emma Duggleby (and then Brown) and a member at Malton and Norton, her individual achievements include winning British, English, European, South African and Scottish championships.

She also played in three Curtis Cup teams and in six European Ladies Team Championships where she went home with three silver medals and two bronzes.

England last won the title in 1993 before Emma's time and now captain of the England team, she would like nothing more than to be part of a gold medal winning side.

"I have a bronze and three silver medals in the championships. It would be nice 20 years on to get a gold," she said.

"I'm really looking forward to the championships. As a player you know what you expect from a captain so hopefully I will be able to help the girls as much as I can. It will be nice to be on the other side of the fence!"

Based at Sandburn Hall where she is club manager and works alongside pro Steve Robinson, who is also England ladies coach, Emma has stepped up to the role of England captain this year.

Vastly experienced as a player she hopes she will now provide the right support for her squad as non-playing captain. "It's more about giving them

encouragement and a supporting role, working with Steve (Robinson) to make sure they have their A game and prepare well.

"The players know it's up to them to stay focussed and believe they can do it. We've come close and we just have to concentrate as individuals and as a team and it's mine and Steve's job to help them win their matches and the championship.

"We have to see how it goes and how we plan out pairings depends on how the players are playing and performing. Steve and I have no say in team selection but he and I will decide the team order."

Hoping to be among those pairings will be Rotherham's Olivia Winning who has been long earmarked as an England player since she played for Yorkshire ladies at the age of 14 and entered the regional and national England set-up at 15.

Her impressive win in the Helen Holm Scottish Women's Open Strokeplay championship at Royal Troon last month where she led from start to finish will not be lost on the selectors.

From the Doncaster area, Olivia, 18, goes to Tulane University in New Orleans later this year and she hopes to be part of the England team at Fulford.

"While I'm not setting any particular targets, I would like to make it into the team for this event. That would be great especially as it is in Yorkshire and if it's anything like it is when it's county match week, the support will be fantastic," said Olivia. "We already have clubs booking coaches for supporters to come to the tournament."

# Coach outlines challenge for Ladies teve Robinson has underlined the

task facing England in July's European
Ladies Championship at Fulford
The Sandburn Hall pro, in charge
of coaching England for six years, has some
excellent players to work with including
European number one Georgia Hall, Curtis Cup
player Bronte Law, British strokeplay champion
Sarah-Jane Boyd and English strokeplay
champion Alex Peters.

"Most of our players have experienced winning and they know how to get across the line," he said, "but there are some great teams in the tournament.

"The standard of ladies golf in Europe is fantastic – Germany, Sweden and Spain will be real threats – and there are no walkovers in this tournament."

Sweden are expected to be the biggest threat as they seek a hat-trick of victories and Steve added: "What are our chances? The same as any other side. I can't guarantee we will win, but I can guarantee we will be prepared.

"It's my job is to prepare the team thoroughly and professionally. You can't ever control the winning, but you can control the preparation and we prepare to the best of our abilities.

"Victory is what we will be going for. If you don't have that aim you might as well not turn up.

"We will have a young team but we have a lot of promising players coming through and I'm not sure about an over-emphasis on experience. My belief is that if you are good enough then you are old enough. It's a great opportunity for some of our younger players to come through and shine.

"Fulford is a course that's been kind to me and I hope it's going to be exactly the same when England play there," said Steve who won the Yorkshire PGA Championship and Yorkshire PGA Masters there.


# **England Expects**

ngland– and Yorkshire – expects a double victory on home soil this year when the men's Home Internationals and European Ladies Team Championships are held in the White Rose county.

Both tournaments will be at quality venues – the Home Internationals at Ganton and European Ladies at Fulford.

There will also be a strong Yorkshire and North-East presence at both events, certainly behind the scenes with Emma Brown captain of the England ladies team and Steve Robinson coach while Graham Walker is also coach of the England men's team.

The chances of representation at the sharp



end are looking good as well with Huddersfield's Nick Marsh and Bamburgh's Garrick Porteous – already a full international - both in with an excellent chance of making the England men's team and Rotherham's Olivia Winning, currently in the England Performance Squad, aiming, like Marsh to step up to their respective full England teams.

"The Home Internationals tournament is a massive event and all about national pride and rivalry," said England international Neil Raymond.

"Players from the four home countries play alongside each other in individual events weekin, week-out, during the year.

"But we play against each other in the Home Internationals and then it's all about bragging rights," added Raymond.

Raymond was joined at Ganton by England colleagues Porteous, Marsh and Jamie Rutherford to get a taste of the course and while home advantage will help, it's all about performance in a tournament played on a round robin basis where all four countries play each other with each match consisting of five morning foursomes and 10 afternoon singles.

England won three titles in a row before Scotland's triumph last year and they won the last time it was held at Ganton in 1989.

Entry is free to spectators for the tournament on August 14-16 as it will be when the best women golfers from 19 countries head to Fulford, York, for the European Ladies Team Championship on July 9-13.

The England Ladies Squad

England men's coach Graham Walker will be very much on home ground at Ganton.

Based at The Oaks club just south east of York for nearly 10 years, he's lead coach to the England squads and Yorkshire County Head Coach.

He's been with England for 13 years and has worked with each of the national squads during that time and has been influential in the careers of the likes of European Tour players Danny Willett, 2012 winner of the BMW International Open, Paul Waring and David Horsey.

Sheffield-born Graham has also been closely involved in Yorkshire County golf and during his 11 years with them, Yorkshire have won the English County Championship eight times, been Northern Counties champions for 10 out of the 11 years and recently completed a hat-trick of English County Finals wins.

"I don't have a vote on selection and I'm not on the selection pane, but I am asked for my opinion," he said.

"The beauty of the selection process is that we have a squad system. You have to take match play results into account but at the end of the day it's all about opinions. The players get a lot of support from England Golf. They represent England with pride."





Garrick Porteous will be considered by many to be an England shoe-in for this year's Home Internationals.

The 23-year-old from Morpeth would be the last to subscribe to that view, but having played a significant role in England's European Nations Championship win in Spain as well as being in the Great Britain and Ireland team for the St Andrews Trophy, it would be a surprise if he didn't make Ganton in August.

Garrick is the first to point out there is a long way to go, starting with this month's Lytham Trophy, which is considered the unofficial British amateur strokeplay championship, but the Tennessee University graduate is rightly seen as England and Walker Cup material.

He shot 74 75 70 69 at Sotogrande as England regained the European Nations crown and was the only team member to count in all four rounds and he's just back from Australia where he finished sixth in the Australian Amateur Masters, the Lake Macquarie Amateur (ninth) and the New South Wales Medal (third).

"Australia was a huge boost to my confidence. It is a long season ahead, but things are moving in the right direction."

Having graduated from Tennessee with a BA in studio art alongside a very successful record in collegiate golf - he was captain of the team -Garrick has never forgotten his roots. "At an early age, I became a member of Bamburgh and it has been my home club ever since," he said. "I grew up in Morpeth, where I played both rugby and golf to county level, but at the age of 16 I represented England in golf and from there on in, golf has been the sport for me and my four years at Tennessee have really developed me as a person and a golfer. The greatest honour in golf so far is to have played for England Men's team in the Home Internationals.

Garrick knows England selection will be based on form, performance and

Yorkshire teenager Nick Marsh has emerged as a consummate talent over the last two years with wins at England amateur level and also successive victories on the professional Gecko Tour.

The 18-year-old from Huddersfield upstaged the professionals by winning successive tournaments as an amateur on the Gecko Tour in December in Spain.

Those victories capped a successful year for Nick who also finished runner-up in the McEvoy Trophy and the Boys County Champions Final and tied third in the Fairhaven Trophy.

He also reached the quarter finals of the British Boys Championship, captained Yorkshire to victory in the English Boys County Championship and was leading individual in the Canadian International Junior Challenge in which England won the team title for the fifth successive year.

Not surprisingly, he was picked for England in the European Boys Team Championships and also the Boys Home Internationals. Now stepping up to the full England side at Ganton in August is very much a target.

"Winning a big event is obviously what you want because you play golf pretty much as an individual, but playing in the Home Internationals is only just behind that," said Nick.

"If I didn't win a big amateur event this year but had a strong season and made the Home Internationals and played for England in my own county of Yorkshire that would be something pretty special. It's a great feeling and privilege to hear your name being announced on the first tee and to know you are representing your country. I experienced it at the Boys Home Internationals and it really makes you feel great.'

Coached by Andrew Nicholson at Wynyard Hall, Nick decimated a quality field in December recording an eight- shot victory in storm-force conditions in the Welsh Open Youths Championship at Bull Bay and when England successfully defended their Boys Home Internationals title he was unbeaten in his six matches.

# Fondly remembered

# Alan Hedley reflects on the passing of three popular county men

hree stalwarts of
Northumberland golf Ken
Doyle, Barry Rodger and
Tim Bull have passed away.

I had the great privilege of getting to know Ken very well when he asked me if I would help Arcot Hall with their centenary history – a task made so much easier by Ken's diligent research.

He'd taken over the collation and collection of numerous photographs, Press cuttings, articles and memorabilia and made such a good job of it, the task of putting together the club history was infinitely easier than it might have been.

Ken held many offices at Arcot including that of club captain and served on most of the club committees for over 20 years and was also captain of the Society of Northumberland Golf Captains in 1979.

He was also a keen pilot and member of Newcastle Flying Club and he probably played more golf courses around the world than some professional golfers as he always took the opportunity to play when he travelled on business. Ken sadly passed away aged 89, in the Royal Victoria Infirmary in Newcastle with his wife Joan and daughter Christine were with him at the end.

Barry Rodger, who died from a heart attack aged 79, was a past

president, chairman and captain of Arcot Hall.

He was also Northumberland County President in 1995-96, chairman of the Northern Counties, a vicepresident of Northumberland Junior Golfing Association, and involved in county golf for almost 30 years and he was a former chief executive of Northumberland County Council.


Tim Bull, who has died at the age of 70, was a member of both Arcot and The Northumberland Club.

A member of Arcot for several years, he played for the club's league team as he did when he became a member of Northumberland where he was a member of the greens committee and a frequent competition winner.

He was also a former secretary and captain of Northumberland County Seniors and, for two years, served on the main Northumberland County executive.

One of his many claims to fame is that he is probably the only North East player ever to have earned a mention in the Ottawa Citizen newspaper.

His moment of glory arrived during the British Amateur Championship at Formby in 1967 when he eliminated the eight-time champion and American Walker Cup star, Bill Cambell winning their second round match 4 and 3.

# Accuracy off the tee is key at Driffield

Don't let the trout catch you out. Alan Hedley discovers the delights of a course which could see you fishing for balls

ew courses can match Driffield for its natural setting and it's considered to be one of Yorkshire's finest parkland layouts.

At just over 6,200 yards and predominantly flat, it's not physically demanding but, with a par of 70, tree-lined fairways, ponds and a trout stream that meanders throughout, the course demands accuracy and is an excellent test of golf.

Water comes into play on holes seven to 11 and also 15 and 16 and a deft touch is needed to handle the greens.

It's not an easy start with a long 438-yard par four and the second is quite a tight dog-leg left - one of many on the course – and the most important thing at Driffield is accuracy off the tee and a solid short game.

After that fairly tough start, the next three are all fairly straightforward par fours, but you have to stay away from the bunkers, especially the case at the short sixth.

The water shouldn't intimidate you at seven but it might at eight as it runs down the left and there's also out of bounds over there.

The par five ninth is not overly long but it is



tricky and with water at various points on the left and trees down the right, position, as so often at Driffield, is key. The long par three 10th is virtually surrounded by water and the signature hole 11 follows (see Factfile).

There's some relief at the dog-leg, tree lined 12th if you avoid the four bunkers up near the green and same applies to 13 and the short 14th.

The short 15th is a little gem and is, in some minds, a candidate for the signature hole and it is a beauty at just 140 yards off the back tee and anything left will be in deep water, while anything right will be in the trees and then there's

The clubhouse was replaced in 1980 but by 2000 larger premises were required and in 2001 major extensions and refurbishment costing £300,000 were carried out. Howard Clark the Ryder Cup golfer and TV commentator opened the new clubhouse in 2002.

It has excellent bar facilities and a lovely restaurant and also boasts a first class pro shop overseen by Kenton Wright, a PGA Professional with over 26 years international playing and coaching experience.

an undulating green to contend with.

There's an excellent finish with a pinpoint drive needed at 16 – anything leaking right will be flirting with a long bunker and beyond it, water and anything left could be out of bounds. A straight drive will leave a short pitch to a narrow green, but it is a chance for a birdie before you finish.

The 17th and 18th are both narrow and longish par fours but, again, good tee shots will set up the prospect of a decent return, but you'll be happy with pars at both of them.

Don't always reach for the driver. Nine of the par fours are under 400 yards. That doesn't mean they are easy but you do have to be accurate and using your head, rather than the driver, sometimes will pay dividends.

#### SIGNATURE HOLE

The signature hole is the par five 11th with its three ponds and assorted streams running across and along the fairway.

Triffield is a Community Amateur Sports Club which means it is open to everyone and it's easily accessible from Hull, Beverley, York and the coastal resorts of East Yorkshire.

Founded in 1923 and initially sited on the east side of the town at Meadow Road, it moved to the current site on the Sunderlandwick estate in 1934. The estate was owned by the late Sir Thomas Ferens and provided for an 18-hole, parkland course, but during the Second World War the club gave up nine holes for agriculture in support of the war effort.

It remained as a nine-hole course until the early 1980's when it was progressively extended to 18 holes and the current layout was officially opened in September 1990. Driffield also has a large practice area complete with two covered bays and a further practice area, with pitching green, nets and putting green close to the clubhouse with another putting green next to the first tee and was awarded the coveted GolfMark accreditation by England Golf.





#### **ALAN HEDLEY'S VERDICT**

Driffield is perhaps the most beautiful course in the East Riding. Well manicured fairways, mature trees and true greens make it a delight.

For a tour professional golfer, the odds come down to 2,500 to one.

# Tip Top Tees to welcome Open challengers

R and A chief promises the world's top golfers an enjoyable challenge in July at magnificent Muirfield

uirfield is reckoned to be the fairest of the courses on the Open Championship rota.
So it would have been surprising if there had been major changes made for this year's tournament in July and the only real change is that Muirfield has been lengthened by 158 yards with new tees on seven of the holes.

With a par of 71, the course will measure 7,192 yards when the world's top golfers pitch up on July 18-21 and R and A chief executive Peter Dawson says Muirfield will "challenge" them.

South Africa's Ernie Els won the Open when it was last at Muirfield in 2002 and Els is the defending champion after Adam Scott's late collapse at Lytham last summer.

The changes have been made

possible thanks to a land swap with neighbours the Renaissance Club which has enabled the ninth tee at Muirfield to be moved back 50 yards, extending the par five to 554 yards, with a new bunker on the right hand side of the fairway and some bunkers moved closer to the green.

"We are absolutely delighted to be back at Muirfield for the 16th time," said Dawson, a member The Northumberland Club in Newcastle. "The ground here is relatively flat and every hole seems to be going in a different direction, but we will be setting the golf course up to challenge these golfers.

"The rough has been cut down over the winter but will regenerate over the coming weeks. We will see the rough up and you are unlikely to win an Open Championship at Muirfield from the rough. The amount of rough is weatherThe famous

dependent, but we will get plenty.

"It's immensely popular with the players. Jack Nicklaus' comment about 'What you see is what you get' at Muirfield was perhaps directed at other links courses with blind shots and where more luck is involved."

Dawson has been forced, once again, to answer questions about the Open being at clubs with a men-only membership policy – Muirfield is such a club as are Royal Troon and Royal St George's, but Dawson insists any move to mixed memberships at men-only clubs would have to come from within those organisations.

In an interview with BBC Sport, Dawson suggested that the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews - and other exclusively male clubs which stage the Open - feel no need to change policy.

He estimates that only one per cent of the 3,000 golf clubs in the UK are single-sex organisations. He said: "50 per cent are men only and 50 per cent are women only. That's a fact that's not often reported."

Augusta recently admitted
Condoleezza Rice and Darla Moore
as their first female members, but
Dawson insists it's much easier for
women to play at Muirfield as a visitor
than to play at the course that stages
the Masters every year.

Dawson added: "I think many people out there think that the R and A run the golf courses in St Andrews and that no women can play. That's absolutely not the case. The courses are entirely public, run by the St Andrews Links Trust and around these courses there are five private clubs that share the public courses with visitors."

But Dawson admits there could be a perception that women aren't welcome at St Andrews and it seems the issue has disappeared at Augusta with a change in the rules.

"I don't deny my job would be made a lot easier if this issue didn't exist, that's self-evident," he said, "but one might choose to respect the wishes of members of these clubs, which are virtually unanimous in a place like St Andrews, that the status quo works extremely well for them.

"We are very aware of what people say. This issue is really quite small, although quite high profile. I think if we have this interview 10 or 15 years from now, we might be talking about quite a different scene. But that's for others to determine."

# Ryding high again

The magnificent 12 who pulled off the most dramatic Ryder Cup comeback of all time in Medinah are reunited for the first time since then this month

urope's magnificent
Ryder Cup team will be
reunited for the first time
on European soil since
the "Miracle at Medinah" when all 12
players and their captain Jose Maria
Olazabal tee up in the BMW PGA
Championship this month.

The West Course at Wentworth Club will be the stage for golf fans to enjoy a belated celebration of that epic comeback when the 12 men and their captain go head to head in an attempt to capture the European Tour's flagship event in front of another huge crowd from May 23-26.

Led by Rory McIlroy and defending champion Luke Donald who is seeking to emulate Colin Montgomerie's record of three consecutive victories, the Ryder Cup heroes and their inspiring leader Olazabal, should guarantee an electrifying atmosphere at the Surrey venue.

Olazabal welcomed the news that his team will assemble at Wentworth and said: "Medinah was an unforgettable experience for everyone who was there, whether it was as a player, captain or spectator, and the BMW PGA Championship is the perfect setting for the players to be reunited to show what they can do as individuals as opposed to the team environment."

McIlroy is relishing the chance to get together with his team-mates again even though, on this occasion, they are intense rivals chasing a record first prize.

"It will be great to have the team back together," he said. "It was such a special Ryder Cup, one that will have a special place in history, and I don't think anyone associated with that team will ever get tired of celebrating it."

And Justin Rose, who began the resurgence of his career when he made his first professional cut in the Great North Open at Slaley Hall, hopes he can step up to the BMW title after losing to Anders Hansen in a play-off in 2007 and tying second with another of the Medinah marvels Paul Lawrie last year.

"The BMW PGA is one of the best tournaments of the year and, for European Tour members, it's our big show, the one where we display what our Tour is all about so it's one that I think every player has an eye on throughout the year and one that we all get going for," said Rose.



# Masters reignites long putter row

Alan Hedley reports on how Adam Scott has as many allies as those who disapprove after his long putter secured The Masters

he row over long putters rumbles on.
Relations between the R and A, the USGA and the PGA of America have been a bit frosty following Adam Scott's Masters victory.


PGA President Ted Bishop described Scott's win as making it as "painful as swallowing a handful of nails for USGA and R and A officials."

The PGA and the PGA of America have made it clear they don't like the idea of banning long putters and in response to what Bishop, R and A chief executive Peter Dawson said: "Some of the comment has been inflammatory and it's perhaps put rule-making onto the negotiating table. We've seen a campaign rather than comment. I don't want to inflame the situation, but I have been surprised and indeed disappointed and Ted knows my views."

Scott was the first to win a major using a broom-handle putter but Keegan Bradley (2011 PGA Championship), Webb Simpson (2012 US Open) and Ernie Els (2012 Open) all used belly putters for their victories.

Closer to home Yorkshire's Jodi





Ewart - now Jodi Ewart Shadoff since her marriage – has been one of the few LPGA Tour players to use an anchored putting stroke.

"I've said this a lot of times, but all you have to do is look at my putting stats to know it's not a huge advantage," she said. "To be honest, if they do decide to ban it, it wouldn't be a huge issue for me. I'd have to spend a couple months really working out with a short putter, but it wouldn't be a huge deal for me.

"If they go ahead and do ban it, then I probably expect to use it and start making the switch in the

off season," said Jodi, who has used an anchored putting stroke since November 2011. "I did actually go back to the short putter in Malaysia at the end of last year for the first round. That didn't go so well. I actually hole more long putts with the short putter, but I'm very consistent with the belly putter within six feet."

It worked well enough for her share the first round lead in the Kraft Nabisco tournament before she slipped back but nevertheless finished in the top 10/20.

Many felt the Augusta win was

just reward for the way Scott dealt with the heartbreak of blowing a four-shot lead with four holes to play at the Open Championship last year.

However, there are many, myself among them who think using a long putter is infringing the rules of golf and while on the subject of infringing the rules, the one shot penalty for slow play imposed on 14-year-old Guan Tianlang at Augusta was heavyhanded and obtuse and smacked of picking on the player least able to defend himself.

Why not single out someone like the fidgeting Keegan Bradley, who must drive his playing partners nuts or Jason (takes all) Day, who was out of position in both his Saturday and Sunday rounds. Day is not alone in the pro ranks for his slowness.

And letting Tiger Woods off the hook didn't help either. Using rule 33-7 to waive the penalty of disqualification for signing for the wrong score has set a worrying precedent. Its use smacked of a desperate ploy to keep the world number one in the tournament. When it was brought in two years


ago, rule 33-7 was not intended to help a player ignorant of a clear rules infraction as was the case here. It was introduced to save a player who could not have known he had broken the rules i.e. something like a minor movement of a ball picked up by a high-definition or super-slowmotion television camera and the offence coming to light after a player has left the recorder's hut oblivious to the fact he has signed for the wrong score. It's a good job Woods didn't win, because he shouldn't have been in the Masters field at the weekend.

Double standards seem to abound with Vijay Singh cleared of doping by the PGA PGA Tour despite admitting using a banned substance.

Fiji's former world number one admitted he used deer antler spray, which contains small amounts of growth hormone. But the World Anti-Doping Agency told the PGATour it does not contain sufficient quantities to break the rules.

"The Tour deemed it only fair to no longer treat Mr Singh's use as a violation," said a statement.

# Florida style in Northumberland

Longhirst Hall's courses are tip-top and really test your ability as Paul Corney discovered fishing for balls

he brainchild of Ashington businessman, Tommy Dawson, Longhirst Hall Golf Club has come on leaps and bounds in recent years. Built on a former opencast site, the original 18-hole 'Old Course' opened for play in 1997 and is still used each year throughout the winter.

The initial layout, created with a classic Florida-style design in mind, is sprinkled with lakes and water features and is home to numerous types of duck, geese and swans all sharing their new habitat with passing golfers. With a par of 73 off the yellow tees and measuring 6,398 yards, the Old Course stretches to 7,160 yards (par 72) from the gold tees and has been skilfully modelled to provide some of the most visually stunning holes in the country.

In total, 42,000 trees were planted for the opening and since then a further 10,000 have been added along with an additional 18 holes, thanks to the hard work of its Golf Director Graham Chambers and his staff.

Chambers explained: "Longhirst stems from the boss's visit to Florida. A number of different

people were brought in to look at getting the course constructed based on the Florida lakes types of designs. In 1997 the original 18 holes opened and that was followed by a second phase of construction of 11 holes which makes the Lakes Course as we know it now and the first half of the Dawson course.

"That was opened in 2002 and we finished off with a third final phase which was the second half of the Dawson Course. Hopefully we will be adding a covered driving range shortly which will give us a one stop centre with a number of club and academy membership options, along with various coaching options."

As for the two courses, the Lakes is a true test of accuracy, with tight fairways and an abundance of water offering a serious examination of course management for even the very best of golfers. The opening hole, a shortish par four is followed by a tough four-shotter. A good drive favouring the right side of the fairway and avoiding the bunker on the right should leave a 150-yard approach, played over water to a green that slopes steeply from back to front.

Played from the yellow tee, the third is a straightforward par five but from the medal tee, it is a monster of a par four where only the longest and straightest of hitters would dare contemplate going for the green in two.

With water all down the left and out of bounds to the right, the drive at the fourth is intimidating and the approach to a long narrow well contoured green with water on three sides, is not any easier.

The fifth and signature sixth are both par threes and to complete the front nine are three par fours where watery graves await any wayward shots. Holes 10 and 11 are fairly straightforward but take care at the 12th because the narrow fairway slopes dangerously towards the lake approximately 250 yards from the tee.

At 292 yards off the yellow tee, the 13th maybe reachable if you are brave enough but a sensible iron to the heart of the fairway should leave nothing much more than a wedge to the green.

The 14th is a fairly tough par three, played over water and the 15th is an even tougher one measuring 201 yards from the medal tee with water guarding the right side of the green.

Some relief at the 16th, a long par five and no water to contend with although watch out for the out of bounds to the left of the fairway.

And then it's the penultimate hole and the most talked about one at Longhirst - it can be a card-wrecker. Avoid the water from the tee and you are faced with a second shot to a narrow long green flanked by two ponds on each side and that's easier said than done, before moving to the 18th, another par five.

## Fears for Eleven Arches

he future of the Eleven Arches Golf Club looks uncertain after it was sold to the Auckland

Castle Estate

Stokesley-born financier Jonathan Ruffer paid £15m for the castle and its collection of Zurbaran paintings and has also purchased the 115-acre Eleven Arches course and driving range on the edge of Bishop Auckland.

It's believed the course and driving range are no longer operating and professional Chris Tyson has left and that the golf course, also known as Flatts Farm, has been bought to protect the views from the castle and park.

Whether there are any plans to maintain the course as a going concern are unclear but if it is permanently closed it will be the second golf course in the area to face closure with Mount Oswald in Durham City also facing extinction at the hands of developers.

The golf course opened in 2008 after being developed by former Newcastle United professional footballer Allan Barker and designed by Durham-based golf course architect Chris Stanton.

It's name comes from the visually imposing Newton Cap Viaduct and its dominating views to the South-West and it's close to Bishop Auckland town hall and Auckland Castle

The castle was the seat of power in the North East and after the Norman Conquest, the Bishop of Durham was granted powers to act as a political and military leader and he was based at Auckland Castle, which is now home to many important works of art.

The par 71 course also has a 350 yard driving range with 14 bays and a former barn with planning consent for conversion into a clubhouse. The Castle has been opened as a visitor centre but whether there are any plans to keep the golf course is uncertain.

# Beautiful Borders

Some of the nation's best golf courses are tucked into a very accessible area, writes Paul Corney





overing approximately 1,800 square miles, the Scottish Borders offers visitors to the region a tantalising mixture of all the very best elements of the Scottish landscape.

From the rolling hills and moorland in the west, through gentle wooded valleys and towards rocky coastlines to the east, the combination provides an air of tranquillity and peacefulness.

There are well over 20 courses to choose from ranging from championship lay-outs at the Roxburghe and Cardrona to stunning parkland courses such as Woll and the Hirsel.

As for accommodation, the region offers many great places to stay – and a personal favourite is the

Collingwood Arms Hotel in Cornhill on Tweed. In 2007, this hotel received a 21st century makeover with award-winning architects collaborating with historians and local craftsmen to refurbish and reinstate period details and restore the Grade 11-listed Georgian building to its former glory.

The hotel stands on what used to be the main road to Edinburgh overlooking the River Tweed. A toll-gate once stood opposite, and the Collingwood Arms, named after Cuthbert Collingwood, one of Nelson's great admirals, still bears the words 'Post Horses' under its name on the façade announcing the coaching inn it once was.

But one of those rambling coaching inns it most certainly is not. A plain, reassuring stone

building with two rows of elegant sash windows, it feels more like a gentleman's residence, with a wide central hall and a well-proportioned library/sitting room leading off.

A couple of minutes drive north of the Collingwood Arms is

Coldstream and the home of Hirsel Golf Club which some describe as the Augusta of the Borders. Set in rolling woodland with thick shrubbery, fierce rough, water and other hazards in abundance the course offers a stern challenge to the accomplished while being sympathetic to the beginner.

A lot of work has been carried out over the winter months by the green-keeping staff and the course is in pristine condition.

Another great place to stay is the Auld Cross Keys Inn in Denholm. The village is situated 50 miles south of Edinburgh, and is only 16 miles from the border itself at Carter Bar. Hawick is the nearest large town.

Overlooking the village green, the Auld Cross Keys Inn enjoys an exceptional reputation in the area




